

Bernardo Ruiz's immersive documentary aims to encourage the Latinx community to hit the voting booths.

The two-time Emmy nominated documentary filmmaker and producer (Harvest Season, The Graduates) followed Latinx community organizers and voters in swing states Nevada, Florida, Texas, and Pennsylvania. Latinx voters are expected to be the largest non-white voting group in the 2020 presidential election.





Author Karla Cornejo Villavicencio was one of the first undocumented immigrants to graduate from Harvard, but it wasn't until after the 2016 election that she decided to share her truth of being on DACA.

Traveling around the country, Cornejo Villavicencio meets with other undocumented immigrants, learning about their unique stories, and discovering more about herself along the way.
