

#### **NATURALIZATION FOR MILITARY SPOUSES**



Lawful Permanent Resident (LPR) spouses of US citizen Servicemembers (SMs) can become US citizens several different ways:

#### 1. LPR for five years: INA 316(a)

Anyone who has been an LPR for five years + has been continuously present in the US for 2.5 years (INA 319(e)) = can apply for naturalization.

The naturalization process can take place in the US or overseas, if the LPR spouse
is living overseas with their SM spouse, pursuant to accompanied military orders.
Time outside the US on accompanied military orders counts towards continuous
presence in the US

## 2. Married to a US citizen and LPR for three years: INA 319(a)

Married to a US citizen for at least three years + LPR for three years (INA 319(e)) + continuous presence in the US for 18 months = can apply for naturalization.

The naturalization process can take place in the US or overseas, if the LPR spouse
is living overseas with their SM spouse, pursuant to accompanied military orders.
Time outside the US on accompanied military orders counts towards continuous
presence in the US

### 3. Married to a US citizen SM who is, or will be, stationed overseas: INA 319(b)

Married to US citizen SM + LPR for any length of time + SM has accompanied overseas military orders longer than one year = can apply for naturalization immediately.

 Generally, the LPR spouse must be in the US for their naturalization interview ceremony.
