SUBJECT: Disabled Veterans Legal Assistance

- 1. Purpose. To provide information regarding the unavailability of client services for Disabled Veterans at the Office of the Staff Judge Advocate.
- 2. Individuals who have been honorably discharged from the US Armed Forces and have received a 100% disabled rating from the Veterans Administration are eligible for a "DAV" ID card. (AR 600-8-14, Paragraph 24-2).
- 3. The DAV ID card is issued at military ID card offices and resembles family member ID cards, but contains the identifier "DAV." Individuals issued a DAV ID card are eligible for "commissary, exchange, and MWR privileges only." (AR 600-8-14, Paragraph 24.2) The language of this regulation is explicit in its authorized activities and does <u>not</u> include legal assistance.
- 4. Former service members who have retired after at least 20 years of service or who have been medically retired are authorized a Retired ID and are eligible to utilize legal assistance. (10 U.S.C. 1044 and AR 27-3) DAV ID cardholders, however, are not eligible for legal assistance under any statute or regulation.
- 5. DAV ID cardholders may seek legal assistance through the following venues: (Disclaimer: Listing these resources does <u>not</u> constitute an endorsement by the US Army or Department of Defense)
 - a. Veterans Administration: some VA facilities host non-VA legal service providers that can assist Veterans free of charge.
 - b. Contact a legal service clinic listed at www.statesidelegal.org or www.veteranslegalcheckup.com.
 - c. Contact your local VA VJO (Veterans Justice Outreach) Specialist who may know of community resources for legal assistance.
